



What is CodeYQR?

This Fall, we are running CodeYQR's Flagship Hackathon in Regina. CodeYQR is a beginner-friendly hackathon for high schoolers where programmers, artists, and engineers will spend a day together building fun coding projects. Participants will work individually or in teams to build fun and innovative software projects while developing technical skills and connecting with other young creators.

Code YQR is a student-led initiative working to create more opportunities for young people to explore technology, develop practical skills, and showcase what they can build.

We're working with [Glocal](#) to help students across Canada to volunteer and support the cause of our organization. This allows CodeYQR to operate through a community-driven and volunteer-based model.

We are also currently awaiting approval to join Hack Club Bank, a program operated by [Hack Club](#), a U.S.-registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. If approved, Hack Club Bank would provide financial infrastructure and nonprofit fiscal sponsorship to help us safely receive, manage, and spend funds for our educational programs and events.

Together, these partnerships will help establish CodeYQR as an effective medium to make technology and innovation more accessible for high school students in Regina.

Who We Are:

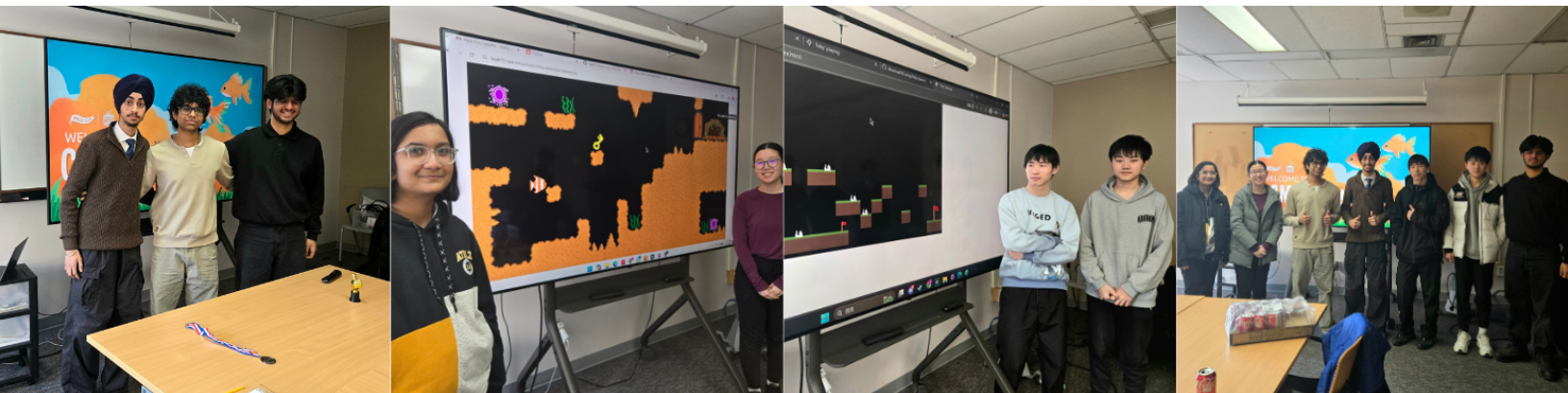
Before CodeYQR, our team organized [Campfire Regina](#), a high school hackathon and the first Hack Club Hackathon held in Saskatchewan.

Although it was a small event, it provided the team with a lot of experience organizing a technology event from the ground up.

Our previous event achieved:

- 12,000+ social-media impressions
- 200+ Instagram followers
- A student-led organizing team
- Full event planning and logistics managed by students
- Food and prizes secured through Hack Club sponsorship
- Experience coordinating participants, volunteers, promotion, and event operations

Our next event is designed around those lessons, with a stronger recruitment strategy, a larger volunteer and mentor network, and a more structured participant experience.

Preliminary Budget

We anticipate 20-35 people attending the event, including participants, organizers, volunteers and mentors

Expense	Estimated Cost
Venue	\$0-\$640
Food	\$350-\$400
Snacks & beverages	\$150-\$250
Prizes	\$300-\$600
Event supplies	\$100-\$150
Estimated Total	\$950-\$2,240

Our venue options currently include the Innovation Saskatchewan Rotunda, estimated at approximately \$80/hour, as well as potential university facilities through the University of Regina and Enactus.

If we are able to secure a low-cost or donated venue, additional sponsorship funding can instead be directed toward participant food, prizes, workshops, and improving the overall event experience.
